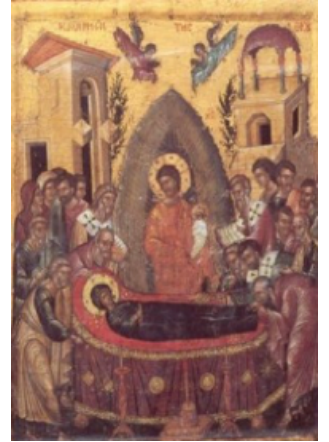

Κυριακή του Παραλύτου

Ἡ Κυριακή του Παραλύτου ἀντλεῖ τὸ θέμα της ἀπὸ τὴν εὐαγγελικὴ περικοπῇ, πὺ ἀναγινώσκειται στὴν θεία λειτουργία. Αὐτὴ περιλαμβάνει τὴν διήγηση τῆς ἰάσεως τοῦ παραλυτικοῦ στὴν Προβατικὴ κολυμβήθρα, τὴν Βηθεσδὰ, στὰ Ἱεροσόλυμα (Ἰω. 5, 1-15). Τὸ δράμα τοῦ ἐπὶ 38 ἔτη παραλύτου συγκινεῖ τὸν Κύριο καὶ τὸν θεραπεύει. Ὁ Χριστὸς παρουσιάζεται σὰν ἰατρὸς ψυχῶν καὶ σωμάτων. Τὸν παράλυτο δὲν τὸν θεραπεύει ἡ κολυμβήθρα, ἀλλὰ ὁ πανσθενουργὸς λόγος τοῦ Κυρίου. Ὑστερα ἀπὸ αὐτὰ ἦτο ἑορτὴ τῶν Ἰουδαίων καὶ ἀνέβηκε ὁ Ἰησοῦς εἰς τὰ Ἱεροσόλυμα. Ὑπάρχει δὲ εἰς τὰ Ἱεροσόλυμα κοντὰ εἰς τὴν πύλην τῶν Προβάτων μία δεξαμενὴ, ἡ ὁποία ὀνομάζεται Ἑβραϊστὶ Βηθεσδὰ καὶ ἡ ὁποία ἔχει πέντε στοές. Σ' αὐτὲς ἦτανε ξαπλωμένοι μέγας ἀριθμὸς ἀσθενῶν, τυφλῶν, χωλῶν, παραλυτικῶν, οἱ ὁποῖοι περίμεναν νὰ κινηθῇ τὸ νερὸ. Διότι ἕνας ἄγγελος κατέβαινε πότε – πότε εἰς τὴν δεξαμενὴν καὶ ἐτάρασσε τὸ νερὸ. Ἐκεῖνος λοιπὸν πὺ ἔμπαινε πρῶτος, μετὰ τὴν ταραχὴν τοῦ νεροῦ, ἐθεραπεύετο ἀπὸ οἰονδήποτε νόσημα καὶ ἂν ὑπέφερε. Ἰγπῆρχε ἐκεῖ ἕνας, ὁ ὁποῖος ἐπὶ τριάντα ὀκτῶ χρόνια ἦτανε ἀρρωστος. Ὅταν ὁ Ἰησοῦς τὸν εἶδε κατάκοιτον καὶ κατάλαβε ὅτι εἶχε ἥδη πολὺν χρόνον ἐκεῖ, τοῦ λέγει, «Θέλεις νὰ γίνῃς ὑγιής;» Ἐπεκρίθη εἰς αὐτὸν ὁ ἀσθενής, «Κύριε, δὲν ἔχω ἄνθρωπον νὰ μὲ βάλῃ εἰς τὴν δεξαμενὴν. Ὅταν τὸ νερὸ ταραχθῇ, καὶ ἐνῶ ἔρχομαι κατεβαίνει ἄλλος πρὶν ἀπὸ ἐμέ». Ὁ Ἰησοῦς τοῦ λέγει, «Σήκω ἐπάνω, σήκωσε τὸ κρεβάτι σου καὶ περπάτησε». Καὶ ἀμέσως ἔγινε ὑγιής ὁ ἄνθρωπος καὶ ἐσήκωσε τὸ κρεβάτι του καὶ περπατοῦσε. Ἡ ἡμέρα ἐκείνη ἦτο Σάββατον. Γι' αὐτὸ ἔλεγον οἱ Ἰουδαῖοι εἰς τὸν θεραπευθέντα, «Εἶναι Σάββατον, δὲν σοῦ ἐπιτρέπεται νὰ σηκώσης τὸ κρεβάτι σου». Αὐτὸς τοὺς ἀπεκρίθη, «Ἐκεῖνος πὺ μὲ ἔκανε ὑγιὴ ἐκεῖνος μοῦ εἶπε, «Σήκωσε τὸ κρεβάτι σου καὶ περπάτησε». Τότε τὸν ρώτησαν, «Ποῖός εἶναι ὁ ἄνθρωπος πὺ σοῦ εἶπε, «Σήκωσε τὸ κρεβάτι σου καὶ περπάτησε;» Ἀλλ' ὁ θεραπευθεὶς δὲν ἤξερε ποῖός εἶναι, διότι ὑπῆρχε πολὺς κόσμος εἰς τὸ μέρος ἐκεῖνο καὶ ὁ Ἰησοῦς ἐξέφυγε. Ὑστερα τὸν εὗρε ὁ Ἰησοῦς εἰς τὸν ναὸν καὶ τοῦ εἶπε, «Ἰδές, ἔγινες ὑγιής, μὴ ἁμαρτάνῃς πλέον, διὰ νὰ μὴ σοῦ συμβῇ κάτι χειρότερον». Ἐφυγε ὁ ἄνθρωπος καὶ εἶπε εἰς τοὺς Ἰουδαίους ὅτι ὁ Ἰησοῦς

Sunday of the Paralytic



Close to the Sheep's Gate in Jerusalem, there was a pool, which was called the Sheep's Pool. It had round about it five porches, that is, five sets of pillars supporting a domed roof. Under this roof there lay very many sick people with various maladies, awaiting the moving of the water. The first to step in after the troubling of the water was healed immediately of whatever malady he had.

It was there that the paralytic of today's Gospel was lying, tormented by his infirmity of thirty-eight years. When Christ beheld him, He asked him, "Wilt thou be made whole?" And he answered with a quiet and meek voice, "Sir, I have no man, when the water is troubled, to put me into the pool." The Lord said unto him, "Rise, take up thy bed, and walk." And straightaway the man was made whole and took up his bed. Walking in the presence of all, he departed rejoicing to his own house. According to the expounders of the Gospels, the Lord Jesus healed this paralytic during the days of the Passover, when He had gone to Jerusalem for the Feast, and dwelt there teaching and working miracles. According to Saint John the Evangelist, this miracle took place on the Sabbath.

Ἐν τῇ Γεννήσει τὴν παρθενίαν ἐφύλαξας, ἐν τῇ Κοιμήσει τὸν κόσμον οὐ κατέλιπες Θεοτόκε, Μετέστης πρὸς τὴν ζωὴν, μήτηρ υπάρχουσα τῆς ζωῆς, καὶ ταῖς πρεσβείαις ταῖς σαῖς λυτρομένη, ἐκ θανάτου τὰς ψυχὰς ἡμῶν.

Κοντάκιον τοῦ Πάσχα. Ἦχος πλ. δ'.

Εἶ καὶ ἐν τάφῳ κατήλθες Ἀθάνατε, ἀλλὰ τοῦ ἄδου καθεῖλες τὴν δύναμιν· καὶ ἀνέστης ὡς νικητής, Χριστέ ὁ Θεός, γυναιξὶ Μυροφόροις φθειγᾶμενος, Χαίρετε, καὶ τοῖς σοῖς Ἀποστόλοις εἰρήνην δωρούμενος, ὁ τοῖς πεσοῦσι παρέχων ἀνάστασιν.

Resurrectional Apolytikion. Mode 3.

Let the heavens sing for joy, and let everything on earth be glad. For with His Arm the Lord has worked power. He trampled death under foot by means of death; and He became the firstborn from the dead. From the maw of Hades He delivered us; and He granted the world His great mercy.

Apolytikion Dormition of the Theotokos. First Tone

In birth, you preserved your virginity; in death, you did not abandon the world, O Theotokos. As mother of life, you departed to the source of life, delivering our souls from death by your intercessions.

Kontakion of Pascha. Mode pl. 4.

Though You went down into the tomb, O Immortal One, yet You brought down the dominion of Hades; and You rose as the victor, O Christ our God; and You called out "Rejoice" to the Myrrh-bearing women, and gave peace to Your Apostles, O Lord who to the fallen grant resurrection.

Εὗρεν δὲ ἐκεῖ ἄνθρωπον τινὰ Αἰνέα ὀνόματι, ἐξ ἑτῶν ὀκτῶ κατακείμενον ἐπὶ κραβάτῳ, ὃς ἦν παραλελυμένος. Καὶ εἶπεν αὐτῷ ὁ Πέτρος, Αἰνέα, ἰαταί σε Ἰησοῦς ὁ Χριστός· ἀνάστηθι καὶ στρώσον σεαυτῷ. Ἐγένετο δὲ ἐν ταῖς ἡμέραις ἐκεῖναις ἀσθενήσασαν αὐτὴν ἀποθανεῖν· λουσάντες δὲ αὐτὴν ἔθηκαν ἐν ὑπερῷῳ. Ἐγγὺς δὲ οὔσης Λύδδης τῇ Ἰόππῃ, οἱ μαθηταὶ ἀκούσαντες ὅτι Πέτρος ἐστὶν ἐν αὐτῇ, ἀπέστειλαν πρὸς αὐτόν, παρακαλοῦντες μὴ ὀκνηῖσαι διελθεῖν ἕως αὐτῶν. Ἀναστὰς δὲ Πέτρος συνῆλθεν αὐτοῖς· ὃν παραγενόμενον ἀνήγαγον εἰς τὸ ὑπερῷον, καὶ παρέστησαν αὐτῷ πᾶσαι αἱ χῆραι κλαίουσαι καὶ ἐπιδεικνύμεναι χιτῶνας καὶ ἱμάτια ὅσα ἐποίει μετ' αὐτῶν οὔσα ἡ Δορκάς. Ἐκβαλὼν δὲ ἔξω πάντας ὁ Πέτρος θείσ τὰ γόνατα προσηύξατο· καὶ ἐπιστρέψας πρὸς τὸ σῶμα, εἶπεν, Ταβηθά, ἀνάστηθι. Ἡ δὲ ἠνοιξεν τοὺς ὀφθαλμοὺς αὐτῆς· καὶ ἰδοῦσα τὸν Πέτρον, ἀνεκάθισεν. Δοὺς δὲ αὐτῇ χεῖρα, ἀνέστησεν αὐτή· φωνήσας δὲ τοὺς ἁγίους καὶ τὰς χήρας, παρέστησεν αὐτὴν ζῶσαν. Γνωστὸν δὲ ἐγένετο καθ' ὅλης τῆς Ἰόππης, καὶ πολλοὶ ἐπίστευσαν ἐπὶ τὸν Κύριον.

Psalm 46.6,1

Sing praises to our God, sing praises.

Verse: Clap your hands, all you nations.

The reading is from Acts of the Apostles 9:32-42

In those days, as Peter went here and there among them all, he came down also to the saints that lived at Lydda. There he found a man named Aeneas, who had been bedridden for eight years and was paralyzed. And Peter said to him, "Aeneas, Jesus Christ heals you; rise and make your bed." And immediately he rose. And all the residents of Lydda and Sharon saw him, and they turned to the Lord. Now there was at Joppa a disciple named Tabitha, which means Dorcas. She was full of good works and acts of charity. In those days she fell sick and died; and when they had washed her, they laid her in an upper room. Since Lydda was near Joppa, the disciples, hearing that Peter was there, sent two men to him entreating him, "Please come to us without delay." So Peter rose and went with them. And when he had come, they took him to the upper room. All the widows stood beside him weeping, and showing tunics and other garments which Dorcas made while she was with them. But Peter put them all outside and knelt down and prayed; then turning to the body he said, "Tabitha, rise." And she opened her eyes, and when she saw Peter she sat up. And he gave her his hand and lifted her up. Then calling the saints and widows he presented her alive. And it became known throughout all Joppa, and many believed in the Lord.

The Gospel According to John 5:1-15

At that time, Jesus went up to Jerusalem. Now there is in Jerusalem by the Sheep Gate a pool, in Hebrew called Bethesda which has five porticoes. In these lay a multitude of invalids, blind, lame, paralyzed, waiting for the moving of the water; for an angel of the Lord went down at certain seasons into the pool, and troubled the water; whoever stepped in first after the troubling of the water was healed of whatever disease he had. One man was there, who had been ill for thirty-eight years. When Jesus saw him and knew that he had been lying there a long time, he said to him, "Do you want to be healed?" The sick man answered him, "Sir, I have no man to put me into the pool when the water is troubled, and while I am going another steps down before me." Jesus said to him, "Rise, take up your pallet, and walk." And at once the man was healed, and he took up his pallet and walked. Now that day was the sabbath. So the Jews said to the man who was cured, "It is the sabbath, it is not lawful for you to carry your pallet." But he answered them, "The man who healed me said to me, 'Take up your pallet, and walk.' "They asked him, "Who is the man who said to you, 'Take up your pallet, and walk?'" Now the man who had been healed did not know who it was, for Jesus had withdrawn, as there was a crowd in the place. Afterward, Jesus found him in the temple, and said to him, "See, you are well! Sin no more, that nothing worse befall you." The man went away and told the Jews that it was Jesus who had healed him.
